e-z Theory: Mood

In this section, we will look at how to make your music reflect different moods.

How do I make my music sound . . . ?

One of the most important things composers do with their music is to make us feel different things. A piece of music, for example could make us feel very happy, or it could make us feel terribly sad.

How does a composer do this?

One way is in using **major** or **minor keys**. You will know from your music lessons that a **major chord** sounds bright and cheerful, a **minor chord** sounds a little sad.

The first thing you probably mentioned is whether it uses a major or minor key.

You probably mentioned the speed and how loud or quiet the music is.

These would be correct.
